To modify is to alter or change something. A modifier can be an adverb, an adverb clause, an adjective or an adjective clause that changes a word in a sentence to make it more descriptive. It can be a word, a clause or a phrase. The modifiers will either alter verbs, nouns, adverbs or adjectives.
