The 'inner man' still remains wholly righteous or sinful, turned toward or away from God, but the 'outer man' (expressing the temporal dimension of human existence, 'coram hominibus') possesses a part/part anthropology. Thus Luther can now speak of a person who is wholly righteous (coram Deo) and simultaneously sinful (coram hominibus).
